cloud [klaud] cloudy ['klaudi]

We sometimes add -y to make an adjective, e.g. sun - sunny, cloud - cloudy, rain - rainy.

on a sunny day?

What do you like doing I like playing football on a sunny day.

Do you carry an umbrella with you?

Yes, I often carry an umbrella with me. or: No, I never carry an umbrella ...

Do we use an umbrella on a sunny day?

No, we don't use an umbrella on a sunny day, but we use it on a rainy day.

Are there a lot of clouds today?

Yes, there are a lot of **clouds** today. or: No, there aren't a lot of clouds today.

Was it cloudy yesterday?

Yes, it was **cloudy** yesterday. or: No, it wasn't cloudy yesterday.

wind windy ['windi]

[wind]

Do you like cold wind?

Yes, I like cold wind. or: No, I don't like cold wind.

Do you think tomorrow will be a windy day?

Yes, I think tomorrow will be a windy day. or: No, I don't think tomorrow will be ...

Is it easy to use an umbrella on a windy day?

No, it isn't easy to use an umbrella on a windy day.
