ought to [ɔ:t tu]
guilty ['gɪlti]
bone [bəʊn]

Ought to means the same as **should**.

e.g. *He ought to clean his flat.*

What ought we to do before an exam?	We ought to <i>study hard</i> before an exam.
What ought you to do today?	I ought to <i>study</i> today.
If you are guilty of murder, what will happen to you?	If you are guilty of murder, you will go to <i>prison</i> .
Do you feel guilty when you don't do what you ought to do?	Yes, I feel guilty when I don't do what I ought to do. <i>or: No, I don't feel guilty when I don't ...</i>
What ought you to do when you break a bone?	I ought to <i>go to hospital</i> when I break a bone .

cigarette [sɪgə'ret]
filter ['fɪltə]
special ['speʃl]

Do most people prefer cigarettes with or without filters?	I think most people prefer cigarettes <i>with filters</i> .
What are cigarette filters made of?	Cigarette filters are made of special paper.
Does your computer have a special programme to filter e-mails that people send to you?	Yes, my computer has a special programme to filter e-mails that people send to me. <i>or: No, my computer doesn't have ...</i>
